


**Barre Chords** 





To know which barre chord you are playing, you need to be able to name the notes on the 'A' string fret board.

Each fret is a semi-tone (small interval between notes) higher than the last.

Which ever fret your first finger is barring on, names the chord.

So, the following chord diagram is of C Major...
